


About the Author

Q: What's your favorite movie?

Q: How do you come up with the ideas for your books?

A: Pondering what-ifs. I wondered what it'd be like to be the first person to travel to another star and the idea germinated in my head for months, resulting in First. The idea for my next book invaded my brain at 3:30 one morning while recovering from jet lag. For my previous three books I pondered the worst thing a main character could do while still being sympathetic to the reader and settled on kidnapping. Yeah, maybe a little dark but I think it worked.

Q: What's your go-to drink?

A: Finally, a good question. The trifecta: water, coffee, and beer. I didn't even like coffee until about eight years ago and now I drink at least three cups every day. Then lots of water the rest of the day. For beer, Guinness. On a hot day, Leinenkugel's Summer Shandy hits the spot. Plus, I live in Texas, so I'm legally obligated to drink Lone Star.

Q: What advice would you give to a young person who wants to be a writer?


A: Take up needlepoint, kid.


